## Plan Ahead

### Top 10 Energy Tips

Estimate your annual savings!

Simple things  
can save you  
money!

1. Close storm windows; use drapes and shades at night to conserve heat.  
Save \$229.46 per year
2. Close flue dampers on fireplace.  
Save \$227.92 per year
3. Install faucet flow restrictors and low-flow shower heads.  
Save \$194.04 per year
4. Tune up your heating system.  
Save \$190.96 per year
5. Insulate, caulk, and weather-strip your home. Save \$187.88 per year
6. Remove and vacuum your furnace filter every month. Replace it when it cannot be vacuumed clean.  
Save \$141.68 per year
7. Close and reduce heat in all unoccupied areas.  
Save \$130.90 per year
8. Replace 60W incandescent bulbs with 13W CFLs.  
Save \$77.20 per bulb over the life of the bulb
9. Set your thermostat back.  
Save \$77 for every degree set back
10. Insulate heat pipes and duct work.  
Save \$2.25 per foot for hot water pipes, \$3.99 per foot for steam pipes, \$2.28 per foot for hot air ducts
