**ARTICLE 1:** Dwayne Woodsome made the motion for Robert Powers for Moderator. Pam L'Heureux, seconded. Robert Fay made the motion for nominations to cease. Dwayne Woodsome, seconded. Voted-passed. Cast of ballots were made for Robert Powers for Moderator to preside over said meeting. Town Clerk, Kerry Thorne, swore Robert Powers into office.

**ARTICLE 2:** Moderator Robert Powers read the article to elect by secret ballot all necessary Town Officials and to vote secret ballot on the two (4) referendum questions at 7:06 am and to close the polls at 8 p.m.

### **REFERENDUM QUESTION #1**

Shall the proposed ordinance be adopted?

The Town of Waterboro hereby ordains:

### **TOWN OF WATERBORO PAY PER BAG SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL ORDINANCE**

#### **Section 1: PURPOSE**

The purpose of this Ordinance is to implement an integrated approach to solid waste management by increasing the Town's rate of recycling and thereby reducing the amount of solid waste disposal, consistent with the State's goals as established in Chapter 24 of Title 38 of the Maine Revised Statues. This Ordinance is also intended to establish user fees for the disposal of solid waste in order to more justly apportion the costs of disposal based upon amounts of solid waste generated.

The Waterboro Solid Waste Ordinance, when enacted, will supersede and repeal any previous ordinance or policy on Municipal Waste specifically the Waterboro Solid Waste Management Ordinance that was voted on November 8, 2005.

## **Section 2: PAY-PER-BAG SYSTEM**

Any municipal solid waste delivered to the Town's Transfer Station, other than recyclable materials placed in the appropriate collection areas at the Town of Waterboro Transfer Station, must be placed within bags approved and designated by the Town. The Board of Selectmen shall establish by order a user fee for such approved and designated bag(s).

## **Section 3: PAYMENT OF USER FEE**

Town designated bags shall be obtained at those locations established by the Board of Selectmen upon payment of the user fee established by the Board of Selectmen.

## **Section 4: PROHIBITION ON DELIVERY TO THE TOWN'S TRANSFER STATION OF SOLID WASTE NOT IN TOWN DESIGNATED BAGS**

No municipal solid waste whether generated at a residence or at a business, shall be delivered to the Town's Transfer Station unless such municipal solid waste is placed in Town designated bag(s)

## **Section 5: COMMERCIAL HAULERS SUBJECT TO REQUIREMENTS OF THIS ORDINANCE**

No commercial hauler of municipal waste shall deliver any solid waste to the Town's Transfer Station if such waste is not in a Town designated bag(s)

## **Section 6: VIOLATION**

Any person who delivers municipal solid waste to the Waterboro transfer Station that is not in a town designated bag(s) shall be in violation of this Ordinance. Any such person may be liable for a fine of \$200.00 per violation. Any person who has violated this Ordinance two or more times may be suspended from use of the Transfer Station for a period of up to two weeks. Subsequent violations may result in suspension of the person's use of the Town's Transfer Station by the Transfer Station's manager, who shall provide written notice of the length of the suspension. Any suspension under this section may be appealed to the Board of Selectmen, which shall hold a hearing. The Board of Selectmen may shorten a suspension period or overturn a suspension only for good cause shown.

## **Section 7: COMMERCIAL HAULERS AND BUSINESSES**

Commercial haulers and businesses will be allowed to unload into the compactor hopper Household Waste that they have collected only if in the proper town designated bag(s).

1. Commercial haulers and businesses that do not use the Town Designated bag(s) will have to take the Household Waste direct to Regional Waste System or any other disposal company licensed by the Town of Waterboro and the tipping fee will be paid as agreed by the hauler and customer.
2. Businesses that recycle can continue to do so at the Transfer Station at no fee.
3. Businesses the need to dispose of so called “special waste” can do so as per the fee schedule.

The polls closed at 8:00 p.m. After closing of the polls, the meeting was recessed until Saturday April 22, 2006 at 10 am at the Massabesic High School in said town at which time the remainder of the warrant was acted upon.

190 were present at opening of the budget meeting at 10 a.m.

Moderator Robert Powers announced the Municipal Officers referendum question results and the election results. Robert Powers also set guidelines of the meeting. A vote was

taken to except the guidelines of the meeting which passed unanimously. Representative Larry Jacobsen was introduced and addressed the audience. Senator Jon Courtney would be introduced and addressing the audience later in the meeting. Also a plaque was presented to outgoing Chairman Douglas C Foglio by Robert Fay and the Board of Selectmen in recognition of his years of service to the Town of Waterboro.

Robert Powers introduced Douglas Foglio as Chairman of the Board of Selectman to comment on the financial implications of the warrant. Daniel Babb of the Finance Committee commented as well on the budget requests of the warrant.

**ARTICLE 3:** Dwayne Woodsome made the motion to accept the reports of several Town Officers for the year ending June 30, 2005. Seconded by Pam L'Heureux. Voted-passed.

**ARTICLE 4:** Douglas Foglio made a motion to accept the Board of Selectmen recommendation as read to vote that all credit balances as of June 30, 2006 in all departments of Town Government be zeroed out in accordance with the April 22, 2005 Town Meeting vote excluding some accounts balances to be carried forward. To be spent under the direction of the Board of Selectmen. Seconded by Bob Fay. Mike DeAngelis motion to move the question. Seconded by Tony Wolfinger. Move the question motion, Voted-passed. Motion to accept Board of Selectmen recommendation Voted - passed

Seconded by Pat Caron Motion made and passed to allow Deputy Chief Ouellette to address the questions regarding this article. Motion by Dwayne Woodsome to move the question, seconded by Bob Gobiell. Voting to move question failed. After more discussion and an amendment to fund \$1000.00 for the study was determined inappropriate due to the current motion on the floor. 2<sup>nd</sup> request to move the question made by Naomi Blow and seconded by Teresa Lowell. Motion to move question Voted-passed. Voted not to appropriate funds for this article

**ARTICLE 11:** Robert Fay moved to accept the Board of Selectmen recommendation to see if the Town will raise /and appropriate \$20,000.00 from Excise for **wiring of the generators** for the Town Office. Seconded by Dwayne Woodsome. Motion was made to move the question by Dwayne Woodsome and seconded by Mike DeAngelis. Pat Caron motioned to move question, seconded by Naomi Blow. Motion to approve Selectman's recommendation came to a count Yea's were 81 Nays were 88. Motion – failed. Second motion was made by Willis Lord to amend the amount to \$10,000.00 for **wiring of the generator** to the new town hall annex only. Seconded by Dan Babb. Motion to move question was passed. Amended motion to approve \$10,000 for the wiring of the generator to the Town hall annex. Voted-failed

To be spent under the direction of the Road Commissioner with fiscal approval from the Board of Selectmen and adherence to the purchase order policy.

**ARTICLE 39:** Paul Verrill moved to accept the Finance Committee recommendation to see if the Town will raise and/or appropriate \$11,000.00 from Tree Growth for an attendant at the **boat launch located on Ossipee Lake**, sponsors of any fishing tournament outside of regular manned hours, will pay for attendant and/or have a trained inspector to inspect all boats and trailers for growth or plants. Hours to be dawn to dusk. Board of Selectman request \$11,000.00. Seconded by Willis Lord voted-passed

**ARTICLE 40:** Paul Verrill moved to accept the Board of Selectmen recommendation to see if the Town will allow state revenues from registration fees derived from the registration of snowmobiles to be placed in a separate account for the maintenance of **Fire Roads** for the year ensuing and to be expended under the direction of the Fire Chief, Road Commissioner and a representative from the Snowmobile Club. **ARTICLE 43:** Paul Verrill moved to accept the Board of Selectmen recommendation to see if the Town will vote to authorize the Tax Collector or Treasurer to accept prepayments of taxes not yet committed pursuant to 36 M.R.S.A §506. Seconded by Mike Harkins. Motion voted passed
