PART 1 Genealogy, 'The steps of connection with someone who lived long ago.' In the pages that follow you will find the vital statistics of all known descendants of John McLucas. Every attempt has been made to present the information accurately, all names and dates on the final copy have been checked with the original information. In case errors do exist, it is hoped that corrections and any additional information will be forwarded to the compiler.

Part II contains a collection of stories . . . glimpses, important and otherwise, into the lives and times of some of our ancestors. We have made no attempt at biographies, merely to share with those interested some bits of colorful information about our ancestors and the farm in Maine in which the 4th and 5th generations lived.

Of the eleven children of Jane and Abraham McLucas only three married. A daughter, Sirena, moved to Iowa; Abraham Jr. lived in New Hampshire; James and his family lived in Kansas and other parts of the West. The 9th generation in these three branches alone numbers 70 (June, 1964) and is scattered from Monmouth, Maine to Oak Harbor, Washington and from Watford, North Dakota to Amarillo, Texas. The Abraham McLucas land is still in the family and, although the farm itself was destroyed in the forest fires of 1947, a new camp has been built on part of the foundation. A portrait of Old Abe hangs over the fireplace and looks out over the same rolling pastures, the stone walls and woods, and the beautiful old graveyard that the early McLucas viewed and loved.

The information found in Part II comes from the farm, from old letters and records, from tales passed down through the years, newspaper clippings and books, and in a few cases from those who lived the events.

The photographs reproduced here are from the old family album at the McLucas Farm.

### INTRODUCTION

The name MCLUCAS appears in the history of Scotland in many times and in many forms (1)

In 1493 Fynlay M'Lowkas witnessed an instrument of sasine of Craginche  
In 1524 a remission was granted to John Maklucas  
In 1502 Donald Maclugash was a charter witness at Castle Lachlan  
In 1618 Gillepatric McLugas acquired the hill of Garrachoran in Glen Lean  
In 1647 Iain M'Clugashe was one of those murdered at Dunavertie. The name is also found in Bute in 1656

In 1664 Patrick M'Clugeis was tenant of Over Ardrosketill

In 1675 Donald Roy M'Lugas in Ardtounishever was denounced rebel

In 1692 John McClugass appears on Kilchrenan Ard, and McLeougas in Nether Lorn

In 1696 Finlay M'Clugash is recorded in parish of Dunoon

In 1698 John M'Lougas appear on Nether parish of Kilchrenan

In the eighteenth century MacLucas and MacClugas are found in Cowal

According to the Duke of Argyll the name has also

become Lucas in Argyllshire

In the North many persons have dropped their MacLucas and become MacDougall

In the South they have taken the name Douglass

In coll, Lucas and MacLugais are now Macdougall

In the Isle of Man the name is current as Clucas

The Cowal MacLucases are reckoned a sept of the Clan Lamond

The name McLucas appears in the United States in the history of York and Saco Valley, in histories of the Revolutionary War and in local deeds and records. Although the spelling varies, it is most often found as McLucas or MacLucas.

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

### THE HAMILTONS OF WATERBOROUGH

It is with a great sense of accomplishment that the Waterborough Historical Society and the New England History Press make newly available Samuel King Hamiltons The Hamiltons of Waterborough in celebration of the bicentennial of the town of Waterboro in 1987.

The research done by Mr. Hamilton for this book was very extensive and extremely accurate. It was certainly a labor of love. The volume includes not only names, dates, and place names, but also descriptions of people, homes, and areas. When known, Mr. Hamilton included occupational, civic, and political information about his book.

The title of the book is misleading because it is truly an understatement. The work includes an extensive history of Waterboro (Massabesick Plantation) and much of York County, Maine. The genealogy is not only a family history of the Hamiltons but includes well over 500 other surnames and fairly extensive family histories of the Allen, Andrews, Bradbury, Buzzell, Carll, Chase, Cleaves, Cluff, Davis, Dunn, Foss, Goodwin, Guphill, Ham, Hill, Hobbs, Horne, King, Knight, Lamb, Lovejoy, McKenney, Mills, Newell, Peirce, Pitts, Ricker, Roberts, Simpson, Smith, and Swett families. It also contains seventeen illustrations, sixty-nine portraits and an index. The illustrations include maps which give some perspective to the location of homes and to the area described in the text. The portraits are obviously a great addition giving the reader the feeling of knowing the people as well as showing us the "Sunday Best" of the times. The complete index is in sections at the back of the book.

The first printing of this volume was a very limited edition of a few hundred copies. It is very difficult to find a good copy and when one rarely appears in auction or estates it will attract over \$125. This reprint, which is planned for a July 1, 1986 publication, will also be a limited edition and will certainly be a collector's item in future years. The only changes made are in overall size, paper type (acid free); and the color of the two crests (which are black and white instead of color because of expense).
