



## Museum and Park Passes Summer Reading Program 2021

*Funded by a grant from the Narragansett Number One Foundation*

***Patrons of the library can reserve a Museum and Park Pass by calling us at 247-3363 or stopping by during regular business hours. We will reserve a date for up to two weeks prior to the date of use.***



The [Brick Store Museum](#) is located at 117 Main Street in Kennebunk. It is a local and regional history, art, and culture museum founded in 1936 by American artist Edith Cleaves Barry. The museum offers a variety of changing exhibits, an interactive family learning space, a seasonal Victory Garden, special programming and events, and a contemporary art gallery featuring local artists.

This pass allows free admission to the Museum for up to five people. This does not include admission to special programs or events.



The [Children's Museum & Theatre of Maine](#) is reopening on June 24<sup>th</sup> at their new location at Thompson's Point with a limited schedule using timed ticketing reservations. The museum recommends that you take out the pass once you have successfully reserved a play session via their website.

This pass entitles the holder to a 50% discount to one play session at the Children's Museum & Theatre of Maine for up to four people. Regular admission costs apply to additional visitors. The pass is not valid for main stage theatre productions or paid programs and does not entitle the holder to members-only events or benefits.

**Pass holders must reserve their play sessions via the website before they arrive.**



[Historic New England](#) is the oldest and largest regional heritage organization in the nation.

This pass offers free tours of twenty-eight historic sites across New England this season, including a visit to the Eustis Estate to view the special exhibition, *Artful Stories: Paintings from Historic New England*. You also receive free or discounted tickets to in-person and virtual programs and events.

To use this pass you must call the membership office at 617-994-5910 or reserve online by selecting the site you are interested in touring and click "Promo Code" at the top of the page where you select a tour date and time. The promo code to enter is LIBSCH121. This will apply your member discount to your tickets at check out. You will need to create an account to complete the purchase. You will need to present the library pass that we give to you upon arrival.



[Maine State Park Vehicle Pass](#) (*this pass checks out for 3 days*)

This pass admits the holder to and occupants of the pass holder's vehicle to all\* Maine State Parks and Historic Sites day use facilities. This pass cannot be used toward camping in Maine State Park campgrounds. A 17 person vehicle is the maximum size allowed with this pass.

*\*Please note that park passes are not accepted at Acadia National Park, Allagash Wilderness Waterway, Baxter State Park, Maine Wildlife Park, Peacock Beach, Penobscot Narrows Observatory, Penobscot River Corridor, Scarborough Beach, Songo Lock or Swan Island.*

**Maine Wildlife Park** The Park is home to over 30 species of Maine wildlife that cannot be returned to their natural habitats. Some are here because they were injured or orphaned, and others because they are human dependent – raised, sometimes illegally, in captivity.

This pass can be used for groups of up to 7 individuals. Each member of the group (ages 3 and up) using the pass will be charged a \$3.50 admission fee. The pass may be used from April 15 – November 11, from 9:30am to 4:30 pm. Visitors can stay in the Park until 6 pm Park and admission gate closing time is set back by 1 hour from October 15<sup>th</sup> through November 11<sup>th</sup>. \* Please note the Park does not accept credit or debit cards for payment. Cash and checks only please.



**Seashore Trolley Museum** is located in beautiful Kennebunkport, Maine.

This pass is for a 50% discount on admission for a family of 2 adults and 3 children. The pass cannot be used for special events such as the Daniel Tiger, Pumpkin Patch and Ice cream night in July and Aug., Ghost Trolley in Oct. and Christmas Prelude events.

You can ride different trolleys throughout the day and as often as you like. Walk through the car barns and see all the trolleys that have been collected over the years.

Bring a picnic lunch or get snack food at their facility. Visit the museum store and see the toys, books, clothing and much more.

[Strawbery Banke Museum](#), in the heart of historic downtown Portsmouth, New Hampshire, is an authentic nearly 10-acre outdoor history museum dedicated to bringing 300+ years of American history in the same waterfront neighborhood to life. The Museum is a place for children, adults, multigenerational families, and groups to gather to explore eight heritage gardens, historic buildings, and traditional crafts, preservation programs, hands-on activities, the stories told by costumed role-players and the changing exhibits that offer hours of fun and discovery. The Museum's restored buildings and open space invite visitors to immerse themselves in the past, using objects from the museum's collection of 30,000 artifacts, and the histories of the families who lived and worked in the Puddle Dock neighborhood to engage, educate, and entertain.
